

## **JOINT RECYCLING COMMITTEE**

**March 16, 2020**

The regular meeting of the Joint Recycling Committee was called to order at 6:26 p.m. in the Albany Village Hall, 206 North Water Street, Albany WI by Chairperson Michelle Monson. Members present were: Monson, Larry Nipple, Abel Schultz and Karl Blumer X-O. Absent: Fred Johnson. Also present: Kim Blumer, Ron Krupke and Delores Dowden.

Proof of posting was verified.

**APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MINUTES:** Motion by Nipple, seconded by Schultz, to approve the minutes of the last meeting as printed. Carried.

**CONTRACT UPDATES:** Discussed the billing, had some questions on the recycle fees and the other fees, the columns do not seem to add up to the total. The township said that at their meeting they did not agree to stop the checks for bags to yearly and they were still expecting them, however nothing was communicated back to the Recycling board about that. They would still like them at the normal cadence as before.

They would like a 2019 quarterly summary from Keepers, explained to them at the next available time once data is received.

Acceptance day is scheduled for April 25, 2020. Brewer will need to make some posters. All the workers are lined up for the day. We need to make sure that trash is in the bag, will not be taking trash that is not in bags and there is no free bagged trash and no free household trash, it will be charged as normal.

Acceptance day is not like it used to be and that is what is costing so much money, people are bringing in household trash that could just go into a bag. Large items are adding up and costing more with the workers and dumpsters. Options would be to only have once a year or not to have one anymore. People are still able to bring items in, they are just charged similar to other places.

**CONCERNS OF RECYCLING WORKERS:** Revenue is up.

**NEXT MONTH AGENDA ITEMS:** Acceptance day (do we continue). Did Pellitari pay us back for the damage, since last spring? Will we be paying the wages and fringe benefits for the village workers when they help with the recycle center on our expense break down? Township would like to take items over to help vent that out, for less cost on the village. Could village take dumpsters out and township put them in? Gill should be calling Krupke to help with some of the labor.
